Expansion & Mechanical Upgrades

Martin Memorial Library was temporarily closed to the public when construction began on an \$8 million expansion project that involved demolition of part of the current library building on East Market Street in York, PA. Additionally, the library expanded its operations into a donated building next door. Overall, the expansion project spanned a year-and-a-half.

The plumbing and HVAC work that CRAFT was responsible for included the demolition of the existing systems and the coordination and installation of three high efficiency boilers, seven circulator pumps, a 125-ton centrifugal chiller and a cooling tower. Tying the whole system together is a vast array of ductwork and piping that connect many other components such as a large rooftop air handling unit and four smaller air handlers. All these systems work together to provide the necessary comfort to the library staff, volunteers and the numerous visitors that occupy the building nearly every day.
